## TRIP DESCRIPTIONS

**REID PARK ZOO SENIOR DAY** This is the one day of the year when the Reid Park Zoo offers **FREE** admission to those over 62 years of age. Vendors will be set up until 12 pm offering items and information of special interest to seniors. Bring your own picnic lunch or eat at the Zoofari Café.

**ANTIQUE FAIR AT LEW SORENSON CENTER** On this first Sunday of the month, the Lew Sorenson Center Park features antiques, collectibles, a “back east style” flea market, food items and more.

**TUCSON FESTIVAL OF BOOKS** is held on the University of Arizona campus and features more than 400 authors as well as a themed speakers’ forum, “Behind the Byline” that focuses on the personalities behind the stories. There is no admission fee and many food booths will be available.

**TUMACÁCORI** Travel to one of Southern Arizona’s most historic locations and enjoy several activities. First, visit the *Santa Cruz Chili and Spice Company’s* gift shop and tasting room to sample various salsas and/or jellies. Then on to *Tumacácori National Historic Park* to see the oldest mission site in Arizona (there is a wonderful shop across the street.) ***Admission to the Park is free with any “America The Beautiful” National Parks pass or \$3.00 without and is not included in trip cost.*** Lunch at the famous *Wisdom’s Café* follows at 1:00 pm with a two-for-one margarita special for those who are so inclined. ***Lunch is at your own expense.***
